establish an arboretum, of course! Join us on February 12<sup>th</sup> to hear how a group of volunteers gathered in 2004 to accomplish the improbable and create a community gem! Called "the hidden jewel" in Northeast Florida, the Jacksonville Arboretum & Botanical Gardens opened in November 2008 – covering 120 acres, offering 7 natural trails through 13 distinct ecosystems. Jacksonville Arboretum's Executive Director, Dana Doody, will also fill us in on the group's Master Development plan, including an interactive Children's Garden.

Dana Doody became the Arboretum's first Executive Director in 2018, bringing with her more than thirteen years of nonprofit experience. Most recently, she served as Director of Development with the North Florida Land Trust. She grew up on the Westside



#### A CHRISTMAS TREE IN AUSTRIA

Two years of my life after college were spent in Germany. My husband was an officer in the Army and I taught American children on the military base of Crailsheim, Germany. We spent every free moment travelling in Europe. An exciting opportunity.

One of the highlights of my childhood growing up in Idaho was the proximity of our town, Twin Falls, to the world-famous resort of Sun Valley. The resort was built by Union Pacific to lure summer and winter visitors. They especially welcomed Hollywood stars and other famous people such as Ernest Hemingway. Sun Valley was fashioned as a Tyrolean Village and many of the ski instructors were from Austria.

I was lucky to be given the means to ski by my parents. A new and exotic sport at the time. I took to it immediately and pursued the sport through the years. Our days spent skiing at Sun Valley as teenagers were memorable.
