

Cumberland Island is a barrier island off Georgia's southeast coast, with protected beaches and maritime forest. The Dungeness Ruins are the remains of a mansion built by Thomas Carnegie, brother and partner of steel tycoon Andrew Carnegie.

We will board the Cumberland Island Ferry in St Mary's, Georgia, at 9:00 a.m. to arrive on the island at 9:45 a.m. Our private van tour will depart at 10:00 a.m. and will take us to the Plum Orchard Mansion, First African Baptist Church, and the Wild Island area. This is the part of Cumberland Island that is only accessible via this tour.

NEW YEAR'S EVE....bah humbug


