#### St. Augustine Lighthouse

Lighthouses symbolize hope, strength, resilience, and the ability to overcome challenges. They can represent new beginnings, awareness, change, and the ability to navigate uncharted waters.

Florida has 40 lighthouses along its 1350 mile coastline. Some are still actively used and some are historical landmarks. The St. Augustine Lighthouse is a 150



year old historical structure, located in America's oldest city. This beautifully preserved lighthouse has a long and interesting history.

On Monday, March 17<sup>th</sup>, our guest speaker from the St. Augustine Lighthouse and Maritime Museum, Inc. will share many wonderful facts about lighthouses and the significance of this lighthouse in the growth of the shrimping industry as well as its importance during WWII.

What would you like to know about lighthouses? Are all lighthouses the same height and color? How many steps are there to the observation deck? Does it still light up at night? Does it have a foghorn? What is a Fresnel? Does a light keeper still live there? What was its significance in the maritime history of our area?

The lighthouse, the Maritime Museum, the light keepers house, a garage and Coast Guard barracks are maintained by a private non-profit organization, and all are open to the public. The SWC Day Trippers will tour the St. Augustine Lighthouse on Friday, March 28th.



Cumberland Island is a barrier island off Georgia's southeast coast, with protected beaches and maritime forest. The Dungeness Ruins are the remains of a mansion built by Thomas Carnegie, brother and partner of steel tycoon Andrew Carnegie.

We will board the Cumberland Island Ferry in St. Mary's, Georgia, at 9:00 a.m. to arrive on the island at 9:45 a.m. Our private van tour will depart at 10:00 a.m. and will take us to the Plum Orchard Mansion, First African Baptist Church, and the Wild Island area. This is the part of Cumberland Island that is only accessible via this tour.

### The Road Trip By Deb Horton

I grew up in New Jersey about an hour from the Jersey shore; or in the summer, it could take several hours or more due to traffic.

For a decade we rented the same house in Pt. Pleasant Beach. It was next to the inlet, and it was our vacation haven for a week. We usually went in mid-August. It was the last fun before the back-to-school preparations started.

So, let me describe the summer pilgrimage to Point Pleasant... 3 adults (my mom, dad and great aunt), 5 kids (me, 3 siblings and a cousin), tons of luggage, lunch for the drive down, drinks, snacks, adult beverages (my mother was extremely particular about her wine), beach paraphernalia, games, books and whew... I'm sure there's more but I'm too exhausted to think about it. Thank goodness we never had a flat tire. We would still be on the side of the road trying to re-pack the car.


All these people and their stuff were crammed into our 1964 Rambler American station wagon. As kids, we were so envious of the Ford Country Squire station wagon that our neighbors had, but the Rambler it was. By today's standards it was completely unsafe; no seat belts, no child seats, kids sitting in the back seat and the back deck untethered; after all it was the mid-60s. As an aside, this car became known as the Devil Car for various reasons.... the lights would come on at random; while driving the seat back on the driver's side would collapse (just a tad dangerous) and the radio would pump up the volume to "blast" for no apparent reason. That car stayed with us for only 6 months; but I digress.

This summer it was our typical road trip departure with eight people going in 12 different directions, my father swearing A LOT, and piling kids and things into the car with the obligatory warning "do not make me turn this car around". Traffic was mercifully light, so we all emerged from the car after 2 hours and started the process in reverse. Kids scattered everywhere and my parents did the lion's share of unpacking. We were all assigned rooms and then we headed to the boardwalk. It was an evening of anticipation realized…ski ball, arcades, rides, hot dogs, malted vinegar French fries ... aka heaven.

Finally, it was time to head back to the house. We were all exhausted after a long day, piled into the bedrooms and slept like logs. First day/night – check!

The next morning, however, was a different story. We ate breakfast and were getting ready to head to the sand and surf when my great aunt emerged from her bedroom and said she couldn't find her false teeth. No, they weren't in their normal spot and no, she couldn't remember where she had them last. So, all the kids went on a scavenger hunt of the house. Nothing. Now it was time to spread out and go back to the boardwalk and visit all the places we had been to the night before. I was 10 years old, and I was mortified having to go into places of business and ask after my great aunt's dentures. The search turned up nothing so back to the house we went.

After several hours my great aunt had a moment of clarity and remembered where she hid them because she didn't want anyone to steal them. And no, I have no insight as to why an elderly lady thought her teeth would be stolen. The rest of the week went on without event, but I stayed clear, for the entire week, of the places I'd canvassed looking for my Auntie's teeth.
